# A Letter from Michelle Woodcock

What sorts of things do you hope for?

There are several things that I am hoping to do this year. In September I'm hoping to run the Great North Run in memory of my dad who died 15 years ago and raise some money for the British Heart Foundation. Other things that I hope to do include at least one visit to Alton Towers which should include as much time spent on fast, scary, going upside down rides as possible and perhaps, sometime this year I may even manage to attend a pottery workshop – something that I've wanted to do for quite a while.

Of course there are many other things that I hope for and often pray about; an end to war, famine, disease, poverty, peace in our communities and the wider world, for people (myself included) to be kinder in the way they think, act and deal with others and for a fairer sharing of the world's resources. Some of these things won't happen in my lifetime I'm sure but I continue to hope and pray anyway.

It's hard to have hope sometimes. Hope is easy enough when things are going well and life is enjoyable, but it's harder to find in the dark places, the times when suffering and pain are near to us in one way or another. I wonder how Jesus' family and followers must have felt on that first Holy Saturday. The day before, they had watched their friend and loved one die painfully at the hands of the Romans. What was happening? He was supposed to be the hope for all the world – the one who would rescue the world. How could he have failed so badly? Was it all to end like this? That must have been a very dark, hope-less day.

God's ways are so much bigger than our ways and so it shouldn't surprise us that this was all part of the plan. Jesus, fully human and yet fully God died on the cross in order that our relationship with God might be restored, that we might have the hope of eternal life with him. What a different day that first Easter Day must have been... shouts of "He is not here, He has risen..." echoing around the gardens and the joy and delight of Jesus' followers as they realised that there was hope and that it was much bigger and better than they could have imagined.

My prayer this month is that you may know something of the joy and hope of Easter in your daily life, especially during those times when hope seems far away.

#### Romans 5: 1 - 5

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us. (NIV Bible)

According to official Government statistics there are almost 1000 people on Jobseekers Allowance in the South Lakes electoral area. Unemployment is worst in the winter months in our area, but with many businesses struggling the summer may not prove that hopeful for people out of work. Each Jobseeker has to 'sign on' every 2 weeks and since the closure of rural Jobcentres, this means travelling to Kendal. There's no help towards travel costs and we all know how expensive our buses and trains are. The standard rate of Jobseekers Allowance is £67.50 a week. Even if the average travel cost is as low as £5, this means 7.5% of the weekly budget is gone before putting food on the table.

Across all Jobseekers, this could mean £10,000 of benefit income spent every 4 weeks simply going to Kendal Jobseehre.

#### POLICE NON -EMERGENCY NUMBER Since the launch of the new non-

emergency police number, 101, it is catching on and is being used more and more by the residents in Cumbria. On average, 25% of the nonemergency calls being made to Cumbria Constabulary are via the 101 number since its launch on 13 December 2011. The new number replaces Cumbria Constabulary's non-emergency number - 0845 33 00... - This number, in time, will be phased out. All calls for Cumbria are still answered by the same Police staff in the Constabulary's Communications Centre. When calling 101, the system will determine the caller's location and play a recorded message announcing the police force they're being connected to. Callers will also hear options to select for neighbouring Forces. If callers are on a boundary between two or more forces, the recorded message will give a choice of which force to be connected to. If a caller wishes to contact a Force not given in these options, then there is a further option to select to speak with an operator who will route the caller to any of the 43 Forces in England and Wales.
