Sunday 11th November

A special Remembrance Day morning worship service in the parish of Underbarrow with Helsington will be held at St. John's, Helsington starting at 10.30. The service will remember the men of Underbarrow and Helsington who fell in the Great War, but will also focus on Captain Richard Jones MC, who survived service in the Royal Flying Corps and subsequently served in the RAF, then as a sergeant commanding an anti-aircraft gun crew during the blitz in Liverpool in 1941. At the end of the service a wreath will be laid on Captain Jones' Commonwealth War Graves Commission grave in Helsington churchyard.

The Feast of All Souls

The Feast of All Souls, which we celebrate in the Western Church on 2 November, made a relatively late entry into the liturgical calendar. It was instituted in 998 by Odilo, abbot of Cluny (France), a monastery which, at that time, was hugely influential and in effect 'controlled' many of the abbeys of Western Europe. These were all Benedictine since, before the Cistercian Order was established in the late eleventh century - this was western Christendom's only monastic Order. Benedictine houses had always commemorated the dead from within their own communities or otherwise associated with them: each monastery kept an ever-extending list of names, called the *Liber Vitae*, or Book of Life, reflecting the theological understanding that those being prayed for had passed to the life eternal. What Odilo did was to extend this to all other unnamed souls who had died, this in turn reflecting a theological understanding that the saying of masses for the dead would benefit those who, because of their venial sins, were in purgatory. The church generally, even beyond the monastic context, had always had a regular practice of praying for the dead: all that Odilo did was give the practice a special day, when three masses would be said; and he fixed on 2 November to associate it with the already wellestablished feast of All Saints on 1 November.

Odilo's new feast-day caught on quite quickly, but not quickly enough to be reflected in the Anglo-Saxon liturgy. However, it spread to England soon after the Norman Conquest, and continued through to the Reformation. Throughout this period masses for the dead and the establishment of chantry chapels for this purpose increased considerably. But the whole idea of purgatory, and in particular the notion that the actions of those on earth could buy relief from purgatory, whether through masses or indulgences, became a major bone of contention in the Reformation. Protestants were firmly against all of this, and so it's not surprising that when the Church of England's *Book of Common Prayer* was compiled, there was no reference to a Feast of All Souls (although All Saints was retained on 1 November as an act of commemoration).

All Souls came back into the Anglican tradition as a result of the Oxford Movement in the nineteenth century which, in developing what we now know as High Church practices, introduced liturgical and ritual customs that in varying degrees looked to pre-Reformation times. Of course, the theology of All Souls remained rather problematic in reformation terms, and so the new - or restored - feast-day was officially called the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed. Although it is not in the BCP, it was listed in the Church of England's Alternative Service Book, published in 1980, and it appears in Common Worship, published in 2000, where it is named in the Calendar as 'Commemoration of the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day)'. However, while All Saints' Day, on 1 November, is listed in Common Worship in bold-red, meaning that it is a major holy day, All Souls (which is given in parenthesis as the unofficial but common name for the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed) is printed in ordinary black type, signifying that it is a lesser festival. The careful treatment of the name of the day in the Common Worship calendar reflects the impact of the Reformation on our understanding



An Evergreen Landscape – 'a chain of English folksongs' arranged and composed by Roger Cann. Land of whichever nationality was more green and pleasant before its spoliation by the hideous fighting of the First World War. This piece expresses something of the innocence we feel about the pre-war landscape and way of life.

Then came 1914 and Europe changed. These songs happen to be in English, but soldiers of all nationalities have sung to keep their spirits up, to dream of home, to power their marching or flagging legs. **Songs from the First World War** – a medley arranged by **Alwyn Humphreys** serves to give us a brief glimpse of the terrible time which we now celebrate as having finished.

We end with Fauré's well-known Requiem Mass in D minor which is known for its peaceful and hopeful nature but has been called 'The lullaby of death'. Fauré never spoke directly about what inspired his interpretation of the Requiem, but it is more than likely that he was deeply affected by his time as a soldier during the Franco-Prussian war in 1870 - 71. He did say, however, "Everything I managed to entertain by way of religious illusion I put into my Requiem, which moreover is dominated from beginning to end by a very human feeling of faith in eternal rest."

Sir David Willcocks, the renowned conductor and chorus master largely responsible for bringing to popularity this Requiem, said: "He [Fauré] wanted it to be something that's consoling and helpful. It's the end of their lives where they [us] can rest in peace" It is this that gives us the title of this concert, 'To Live in Hope' which surely is what all the survivors of the war, military and civilian both, needed in order to pick up the wrecks of their lives and try to

HELSINGTON & BRIGSTEER

Helsington Parish in 1841

How can we get some idea of life in Helsington 187 years ago? Well the census of all residing in the parish at midnight on Monday the 7th June, 1841 is a good start. The census record covers 42 households in Brigsteer, Sizergh, Prizet and all the outlying farms of



Helsington, pretty much everywhere in the parish today. The total population was 255, compared to something like 330 today, but of a very different complexion. It was virtually wholly dependent on agriculture, with 15 farmers and 66 agricultural labourers, of whom 18% were members of the farmer's family. 31 wives "of no occupation" were busy looking after their husbands, homes and 96 children not yet working, besides their children already in employment, to say nothing of helping on the farms.

There was a fairly marked division of wealth between the village of Brigsteer and the rest of Helsington. In the 17 households of the outlying districts there were 26 domestic servants, almost all working in the farmhouses and at Sizergh Castle. The bigger outlying

farms of Larkrigg, Hawes, Bridge House, Berryholme, Holeslack, High House, Sizergh and Low Sizergh accounted for 63% of the population outside Brigsteer. Sizergh Hall (Castle) was the sole grand house, then occupied by William Brewson, banker, though on the farms lived 8 persons of independent means. In the 25 households of Brigsteer (from Park End to Kistwells) there were just 3 farmers (employing 3 domestic servants) but 27 agricultural labourers employed on all the surrounding farms. Some lived in named cottages still familiar to us today - Kistwells, Scar House, Syke Side, Hill House, Sunny Bank - but most in un-named cottages, many small but housing up to 11 people. Here in the village lived the few employed in what we would call manufacture and services: tallow chandler, spinner of worsted, peat seller, gardener, waller, nurse, publican and schoolmaster. With the exception perhaps of the banker and schoolmaster, none is recognisable as an offcomer. Nor indeed would many have afforded to travel far; for most their only recourse outside the home was the church or The Wheatsheaf. They probably regarded the countryside as just their workplace.

In a later article we'll look forward to 1911 to see how much had changed.


