A LETTER FROM MICHAEL WOODCOCK

Dear friends,

Before we can believe it we are at the end of another year. The Church's Year actually begins this month on Ist December with the first Sunday of Advent. Thanks to generous donations from several of our village congregations we have been able to give each family in our local Church School in Crosthwaite a gift of The Real Advent Calendar, which tells the real story of Christmas with a special Family Activity book accompanying it. But we haven't reached Christmas yet. The season of Advent helps us take a little time



to prepare. Each Sunday we build our sense of anticipation as each week we light one of the Candles on our Advent Wreaths – four for each of the Sundays and one for Christmas Day. There are many variations of what each candle represents, but one version gives each candle the meaning of hope, faith, joy, peace, and light & purity. We could certainly do with a good dose of hope in the world today, not least in our own country as we go to the Polls this month and elect a new Government.

For some people, the prospect of Christmas is daunting. Perhaps families are fragmented or dysfunctional? It can be a very stressful and daunting prospect sometimes when families gather. Perhaps we have faced illness or even the loss of a loved one this year? Perhaps the financial pressures of Christmas become too much? Perhaps we will be alone this Christmas? Perhaps we just find Christmas a really difficult time when everyone around us seems to be happy (although appearances can be deceptive)? This year we are offering an alternative simple Christmas Carol Service entitled "The Longest Nights". We will sing a few Carols, though not too many; we will hear some Christmas Bible readings, but not too many; we will make it a short and sympathetic gathering for those who may just be struggling to enjoy Christmas in the usual way this year. The service is for anyone who lives in our seven villages (and beyond) and is at 7.30pm on Thursday 19th December hosted in St. Mary's, Crosthwaite. Why not come along?

See also all the other Christmas gatherings in our churches by referring to page 3 of this magazine; you are most welcome at any of them.

Underlying all the glitz, commercialism, and empty promises of a secularized Christmas, there is a different message of hope and joy. We do tend to discover within ourselves and in this special season a greater capacity for warmth and joy compared to the rest of the year. Perhaps the gift of God's son, in the birth of Jesus, is a gift that spreads unexpectedly to us and we experience the love of God working amongst us? We need hope and joy. One way or another, I hope that you may find some this year as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ once again.

I'm looking online for fancy dress costumes for my kids. But I'm worried as I've read stories about some costumes not being fire-safe and some children being hurt. What should I look for to keep them safe?

Unfortunately you're right. There have been a number of incidents where children's costumes were set alight by accident. Check the costume comes with safety instructions, a CE marking and the manufacturer's name. A CE marking means the product complies with health and safety requirements, and the product has been tested for flammability. (Sometimes a fake CE mark is used. A giveaway is the middle line of 'E', which should be shorter than the other parts.)

Make sure you're buying from a reputable online retailer. Find out as much about them as you can, like customer reviews, or ask them directly for safety information. Also check whether the product has ever been recalled before, on the website productrecall.campaign.gov.uk.

Talk to your children about how best to stay safe while having fun in fancy dress, like keeping away from candles and open flames. And if you're in doubt, don't buy the product. You can always contact Citizens Advice consumer helpline on 03454 04 05 06 for further help or to report an issue.

RECERCION DE LA COUNCIL DE NOVEMBRE 2019

The Parish Council met on Tuesday evening 05 November to discuss business. A full set of draft minutes showing decisions is available on the Community Web site http://crosthwaiteandlyth.co.uk/ along with a copy of the agreed October minutes.

• Open Forum

- ♦ There were 16 people present, along with councillors for this meeting. The Chairman commented how good it was to see so many turn out on a November night.
- \Diamond There was only one subject to be brought up in the Open Forum, and that was the Planning Application 7/2019/5613 The High, Hyning Brow.
- \Diamond Councillors listened at all comments which lasted for over an hour with nobody speaking in support of the application.
- \Diamond Objections raised by members of the public included :-
- \Diamond Farm Diversity this is not normal for farm diversity, it is a major development.
- \Diamond Access is totally unsuitable for any development at this site, in particular the turn of from the A5074
- \Diamond UNESCO World Heritage this goes against the ethos of this status
- $\lozenge \ \ \ Visibility-`The \ High'\ can \ be\ seen\ from\ Crosthwaite\ Village,\ the\ Winster\ and\ Lyth\ Valleys;$

and any development will be detrimental as it would be visible day and night.

- Water supply was a big issue and is a subject that the Parish Council has been pursuing for some time.
- ♦ Local Occupancy evicting tenants and moving the local occupancy is not satisfactory.

Reports

SLDC Councillor John Holmes reported that SLDC have been :-

- ♦ Looking at the installation of 7 charging points for electric cars
- ♦ 'Get Safe On-Lime' project has meetings at Ambleside, Ulverston, Barrow and Grange
- ♦ Contingency plans are in place for a 'hard Brexit'.
- ♦ 468 homes have been provided towards the target of 1000 by 2025
- ♦ Free parking on on each Sunday in Dec ember leading up to Christmas
- ♦ The Millennium Wood will be thinned out using horses
- ♦ Glebe Road car park in Bowness reduced to 128 spaces to next Easter

• Planning

The Council agreed that it has no objection to the following planning applications

- \Diamond A grant of £5270 has been received to cover the work planned up to the end of the financial year.
- \Diamond Kirkwells have highlighted several issues which the group will be discussing with LDNPA in December.

The Clerk will be continuing to raise the matter for water outages with United Utilities.

It would be wonderful if we could build up pledges of many Legacies for the future, as this would help ensure the survival and flourishing of our local church.

Update on Witherslack Church Restoration Project

We are making progress on our applications to Grant funders for Phase One of our restoration Project. As you know this includes the restoration of the Tower which is the most expensive part, and alongside this the construction of a disabled-access toilet and small kitchenette. The only way we will be in with any chance of raising the money we need from Grants is if we were to include a toilet and kitchenette. Funders these days receive literally hundreds of applications and they state quite categorically that they will not be interested in investing their money in our project unless we can make the case that significantly more people will be engaged with our building and heritage. We cannot hope to encourage a greater use of the building unless we can offer such modern-day and expected conveniences. With an ageing population and the need for easy disabled-access as the law requires, our facilities need to be in line with these expectations and what is more Grant funders also expect it. That's just the way of it. We would never be able to raise enough money just for the Tower without applying for Grants and we won't get any Grants unless we can demonstrate a greater use of the building. As you can imagine, this is quite hard and pain-staking, working up each application and ensuring we comply with their requirements and expectations. But we only have one shot at this, and we are determined to try our best and seek to restore St. Paul's for the village. The alternative is to give up and let the building slowly fall into further decay and eventual closure. 
