# GENERAL RULES

*The classes are open to all those living in the parish of Crosthwaite and Lyth and the adjoining parishes of Underbarrow, Crook, Witherslack, Winster, Cartmel Fell and Bowland Bridge, Brigsteer and Helsington, and Levens, as well as members of village organisations.*

*Entry forms and fees must be submitted at the Memorial Hall on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> June 2022 between 7:00 pm and 9:00 pm or may be delivered or posted to Pat Howarth, Cedar Lodge, Crosthwaite, Kendal, LA8 8HX by noon on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> June 2022.*

*Every exhibitor must have his or her own form. Entries may not be made in joint names.*

*On the morning of the Show only exhibitors will be allowed in the hall to stage their own exhibits.*

*The judges shall have power, according to the standard of any exhibit, to reduce or withhold any prize.*

*Presentation and quality of all the exhibits are important criteria, and the decisions of the judges will be final.*

*Exhibits or cards may be removed after 3:30 pm. Exhibits not removed by 3:45 pm will be made available to the public by donation. The committee cannot accept responsibility for any items remaining in the hall after this time.*

*All matters not provided for above shall be left to the discretion of the Show committee.*

## CATEGORY A - CUT FLOWERS

Exhibitors should bring their cut flowers on the morning of the Show and use the vases provided for presentation (except class 10, where the exhibitor will provide their own bowl).

**Up to THREE ENTRIES PER PERSON may be made in this category.** Exhibits in Art, Photography and Handicraft classes must have been made within the past 5 years. Once shown in the Show they may not be entered again.

To help with the display of Artwork and Photography please bring exhibits to the hall on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> June between 7:00 pm and 9:00 pm.

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### **ARTWORK**

All **Artwork** can be produced using **any medium** and must be the original work of the exhibitor. Artwork should not be taken from any other person's work.

All framed artwork must be strung for hanging and should not exceed 22 x 18 inches in total. The exhibitor's name must be clearly written on the **BACK** of the artwork in the **TOP RIGHT HAND CORNER**.

### **PHOTOGRAPHY**

**Photographs** must not be enhanced but may be commercially developed and printed. They may be any size not exceeding 5 x 7 inches excluding any mounts. Total exhibit not to exceed 6.5 x 8.5 inches mounted on card, but not covered in any way. The exhibitor's name must be clearly written on the **BACK** of the photograph in the **TOP RIGHT HAND CORNER**.

- Stalks to be left on cabbages and the calyces on tomatoes.
- Stalks should be intact on fruit wherever possible.

## **CATEGORY C - POT PLANTS**

*Any pot plant entered must be purchased prior to 2020.*

## **CATEGORY C - FLORAL ART**

*For the Floral Art the arrangements must be pre-prepared. Only final staging should be done at the hall on the Saturday morning. The flowers or foliage in the Floral Art entries (52 and 53 below) may be bought or garden grown.*

Definition: <i>(A Victorian posy consists of a flower in the centre, surrounded by circles of different flowers, each circle being of one colour. The outer circle should be of leaves.)</i>

### **Raspberry Bakewell Cake (CLASS 70)**

*Baking time 50 to 55 minutes 20 cm cake tin with 6 cm sides*

**For judging purposes, the cake should not be decorated on the top in any way**

#### **Ingredients:**

150g butter, softened, plus extra for greasing	150g caster sugar
2 eggs	A few drops of almond essence or extract
50ml milk	150g self-raising flour, sifted
150g ground almonds	150g fresh or frozen (and defrosted) raspberries
25g flaked almonds	

#### **Method:**

**Preheat** the oven to 180°C / Gas 4. Butter sides of a 20 cm cake tin and line the base with a disc of baking parchment.

**Cream** the butter until soft in a large bowl. Add the sugar and beat until the mixture is light and fluffy.

**Whisk** the eggs and almond essence together in a small bowl for a few seconds until combined, then gradually add the eggs to the creamed butter mixture, beating all the time. Next beat in the milk, then add the flour and ground almonds, carefully folding these in until they are just mixed.

**Add** the raspberries and fold in gently, so as not to break them up too much. Tip the batter into the prepared tin and scatter the flaked almonds over the mixture.

**Bake for 50-55 minutes** or until a skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean.

**Remove from the oven** and allow to cool in the tin for 10 minutes. Use a sharp knife to loosen the edges then carefully remove the cake from the cake tin. Peel off and discard the parchment and leave on a wire rack to cool before transferring to a serving plate.
