








A LETTER FROM MICHAEL WOODCOCK

Everyone is welcome! This is the message our churches in this Two Valleys team wish to convey. And by everyone we include those who may have come from a different denominational background to the Church of England. In most of our villages the only church presence is the Anglican church; there are no Methodist, Baptist, Roman Catholic, United Reformed church buildings within our parish boundaries. Therefore everyone is left with a choice; either to travel quite some distance to find the nearest, say, Methodist church, or to take the plunge and join the Anglicans!

Our PCCs have become increasingly conscious of this and some of us have recently agreed on a Declaration of Ecumenical Welcome which has been pinned up on some of our Noticeboards. The words of this Declaration are as follows:

A Declaration of Ecumenical Welcome and Commitment

As the only denominational church in this parish we welcome people of all Christian denominations to share in the life and worship of this place.

You are more than welcome to join us at any of our services and, if baptised and communicant members of another Church, to receive Holy Communion here.

We are the body of Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised into one body. We meet in his name and share his peace.

Let us be clear that we are not intending to poach members of other congregations, but simply to say that people of all backgrounds would be welcome to join us in their local church. This is of fundamental importance to me, as I think of myself first and foremost as a "Christian", and it is only of secondary importance that I happen to find myself being an Anglican. In fact I grew up attending both my local Baptist and Anglican churches at different stages through the various organizations they both ran: Nursery school; Sunday School; Church Choir; Bible Club; Boys' Brigade; Youth Group, et cetera. What is of first importance is that we follow Jesus Christ; He doesn't mind if we are Methodist, Baptist, Catholic, or Anglican. It is only of secondary importance whether we happen to be Baptist, Methodist, Catholic or Anglican.

We have come a long way in terms of church unity. There is still and probably always will be a long way to go, but Christians today are much more open and accepting of each other; recognizing and often celebrating our differences and the strengths we can share with one another.

Of course, some of you are committed members in your own denominations and that is right and good, but we would also want you to feel welcome to join in with your local village church from time to time and wherever you felt it to be appropriate.

As we approach Christmas and the many Carol Services being planned, we do hope that those of you from any or no denomination will feel welcome at any of our services.

The Peace of the Lord be always with you

Marjorie Prickett - A Life remembered...

Marjorie was born at Wray Farm Docker on 14th February 1912. She had two sisters and a brother: Evelyn, Doris and Billy. Her father had been born and brought up at Tranthwaite in Underbarrow, then part of the Lowther Estate, and this continued to be farmed by Marjorie's aunt and uncle. But her uncle died young and Marjorie's father was asked to take over the farm in 1917 when Marjorie was 5 years old. However in 1922 heavy death duties forced the Lowther estate to sell, and Marjorie's family moved temporarily to Thorns Villa. In 1923 her father bought Chapel House a small farm of 39 acres near All Saints' Church in Underbarrow for £1950. Almost from the first Mrs Prickett with the help of her daughters started taking visitors on full board consisting of breakfast, lunch, high tea and a supper tray. They also had one set of long-staying guests who helped pay for the installation of a bathroom in 1931. The water supply was from a spring in the orchard below the farm, and one of Marjorie's and Evelyn's duties was to pump the water by hand from the orchard tank into the house. An electric pump arrived in 1938 when mains electricity reached the house for the first time. Marjorie's sister Doris died in 1926 of septicaemia following an operation, and her brother moved to run a dairy in Liverpool which involved keeping cows indoors. When the cows reached the end of their lactation Billy put them on the train to Staveley where they were met by her father and Marjorie who walked them back to Underbarrow. These were the days when farming was a hard existence and stock also had to be walked to market in Kendal, and back again if as occasionally happened they did not sell! Her father died in 1936 when much of the land was let out and Mrs Prickett and her two daughters made a living taking in visitors and selling produce in Kendal market. A key incentive in Marjorie learning to drive at age 50 (of which she was proud) was the difficulty of getting the produce into Kendal due to the vagaries of the local bus service! Another of Evelyn's and Marjorie's physical tasks was to roll the tennis court in the Mill Dam field for the use of the visitors. Mrs Prickett died in 1957, and the sisters continued to take visitors at Chapel House until it was sold in 1971 when they moved to their new bungalow Lynwood in Chapel Lane. Evelyn died in 1983, but Marjorie continued to take visitors until 1996 when she was 84. To this day past visitors who were children in the 1940's and 50's appear in Chapel Lane enquiring about the family and telling tales of the wonderful hospitality they received. Similarly some Underbarrow folk still remember being invited to feasts at Chapel House after pigs were killed.

Marjorie was a keen gardener and the garden at Lynwood was kept in good order with help from Caroline Sale and other neighbours until 2000 when Marjorie gave up driving and moved to Kendal to be near her great friend Mary Wharton. She kept the much smaller garden at her bungalow in good order too, and even this year raised her own to-

mato crop from seed giving the surplus to her friends.

Marjorie was involved in many village activities. She was a keen member of the WI from very young and a supporter of the Institute. It was very fitting that she was asked to open the newly refurbished Institute in 2000. She was also a great supporter of All Saints' Church and the clergy. For much of her life there were really only two houses on Chapel Lane, the farm and the vicarage. She was a great support to the Reverend Robert Bowers and his sister, and helped to nurse him in his last illness. She opened and shut

the church for many years and also stoked the old coal-fired boiler. She was secretary of the PCC for 32 years. She continued to support church events in Underbarrow right up until her death. Few if any one can have done more for the church in Underbarrow since the new building was erected in 1869. Marjorie died in hospital on 26th October.

Clamping to be banned – know your rights!

Wheel clamping and towing away on private land, such as shopping centres and residential car parks, is to be banned by the coalition government as part of the Freedom Bill to be introduced in November and which will come into force after Royal Assent. The CAB is collecting evidence of good and bad practice to make sure that new rules are being used. You can help by letting us know your experiences.

The ban will apply to private land only and will not change existing traffic rules from

local authorities and the police. The ban covers all forms of vehicle immobilisation, including towing and clamping.

When the new rules are implemented, anyone who clamps, tows or immobilises a vehicle on private land without specific legal authority to do so will face criminal proceedings or civil sanctions.

Individuals are still able to clamp or block in their own vehicles (for example, to prevent theft) and bailiffs with the lawful right to do so will still be able to clamp vehicles in lieu of outstanding debts.

Buying presents? Know your rights!

If you choose to buy goods from the comfort of your home it is called 'Home shopping' and includes anything purchased by post, telephone, fax, email, mobile phone, interactive TV and the Internet.

You have the same rights as if you had bought from a High Street shop, the goods must match their description and advertising claims, be of satisfactory quality and they must be safe.

Did you know that you also have additional rights when you buy without meeting the seller face to face? These include the right to:

- clear information including any extra charges such as delivery or VAT,
- cancel your order at any time up to 7 working days after you received the goods
- have goods delivered within 30 days
- protection from fraud, if someone makes dishonest or fraudulent use of your payment card, you can cancel the payment and the card issuer must refund all the money to your account.
- keep or dispose of any goods you receive but have not ordered, if a seller demands payment for unsolicited goods you don't have to pay or return the goods.
- a cooling off period of 7 working days after placing an order, however you cannot
 cancel if you buy goods which were made to order, perishable, newspapers, software,
 and audio or video recordings which have been unsealed.

These rights do not apply to food or drink, timeshare agreements or financial services such as a loan. Be aware that there are different rules if you buy goods from a private individual or from Internet auction sites such as eBay or the seller is based outside the EU.

HELSINGTON COMMUNITY TRUST

Looking back over the last few decades the parish of Helsington and in particular the community of Brigsteer has lost a number of community resources, the shop, post office, church hall and school. Some local residents have recognised this diminution of community held resources and a Community Trust has been identified as the best way to address this loss. Following on from initial discussions at Parish Council level a Steering Group was set up in Autumn 2009 with the aim of establishing the viability of a Community Trust. The group has a vision for re-establishing community held capacity which they feel will be needed to support a thriving and sustainable parish in the future.

A Community Trust is established in a community to acquire fixed assets and then hold on to them in perpetuity for local use. They work on a non profit basis raising money from new sources and unlock-

ing other resources to provide and manage housing, workspace, community buildings and green spaces including allotments. CTs can also be registered with the charity commissioners.

CTs work by enabling occupiers to pay for the use of buildings and services at prices they can afford while the value of land, subsidies, planning gain and other equity benefits are permanently locked in on behalf of them and future occupiers by the Community Trust.

CTs are an expression of community engagement and they offer a new set of legal, financial and resource management tools to communities to establish, maintain and build resources held by the community for the community into the future. Affordable Housing is one obvious route for the Helsington CT to pursue. A local housing survey carried out in April 2008 has identified a need in the parish for 17 affordable homes.

The members of the original steering group are: Mike Whelan, Vice Chair of Helsington Parish Council: Andrew Dobson, Parish Councillor; Neil Richardson Parish Councillor; John Park, Local resident; Mike Whorwood, Local resident; John Griffiths Local resident; Tim Harmer, Vicar to the Parish. The group has now formed itself into a not for profit limited company called Helsington Community Trust and has obtained grant funding to set up and take the vision of the Trust forward. We will hold an open public meeting at Brigsteer Village Hall on Monday 6th of December at 7.30pm to share our vision and in particular discuss the need for affordable homes within the parish.
