A LETTER FROM MICHAEL WOODCOCK



Dear friends.

At the time of writing this, our Country has only just heard the breaking news of the death of our beloved Queen. As you read this, we will all still be coming to terms with this great loss and beginning the long processes of adjustment that face us. It has been true to say that Her Majesty's influence on so many of us has been profound, even though the vast majority of us never met her; this loss, it seems, feels both personal and national (indeed international).

Any kind of loss stirs things deeply within us and brings to the surface our truest feelings. This is often revealing, and we learn much about ourselves and those we love. At the Special Service held at St. Paul's Cathedral the day after her death, the Bishop of London quoted one of our most eminent current-day theologians N.T.Wright. The fuller quotation is here: "Now love doesn't stop at death – or if it does, it's a pretty poor sort of love! In fact, grief could almost be defined as the form love takes when the object of love has been removed; it is love embracing an empty space, love kissing thin air and feeling the pain of nothingness. But there is no reason at all why love should discontinue the practice of holding the beloved in prayer before God."

We sincerely grieve the loss of Queen Elizabeth II; so much has already been said about her faithfulness, humility, and her deep sense of service and duty. Her death will have stirred up other kinds of losses we may be facing, as well as recent bereavements. We, all of a sudden, find ourselves processing and feeling these losses afresh. Emotions rise to the surface and we become more human as a result.

Meanwhile, we look to the future. Our country will not collapse. For many years, many wrote off Prince Charles and did not consider the monarchy would survive long beyond Elizabeth II. However, from his very first day as King Charles III, he has impressed us with his words and actions, and the crowds of people encouraging him with spontaneous cheering and shouts of "God save the King" have shown that we will be able to move forward.

In his speech to the Nation, King Charles, reflecting on the past 70 years, said that the "Our values have remained, and must remain, constant". He also said he would "endeavour to serve (us) with loyalty, respect and love." Those are three interesting words to have chosen and are worth us remembering; if we all sought to serve one another with loyalty, respect and love we would be creating ever stronger communities.

We give thanks for our gracious Sovereign Lady, Queen Elizabeth.

We ask God to bless His Majesty King Charles III.



Edward the Confessor

King Edward (ruled 1042-1066) is one of several royal saints of Anglo-Saxon England. All except Edward achieved their sanctity by popular acclaim, the way saints were always made in the western church until a more legalistic papally-controlled procedure developed in the twelfth century. In early centuries people were often acclaimed as saints because of their steadfast willingness to die for the faith in the Roman persecutions, so becoming 'martyrs' from the Greek for 'witness'. Later, when the historical circumstances no longer exacted this extreme form of witness, the church began to use the term 'confessor' for those marked out as saintly figures by the manner of their life. Edward, who later became Edward the Confessor, died in his bed on 5 January 1066. But he was not canonized until 11 February 1161, when Pope Alexander III, using the new system for making saints, issued a sealed proclamation (a papal bull). Edward is consequently the only English king to have been canonized by the Pope using this quasi-legal procedure.

You may wonder what he did to deserve it. The short answer is: not a lot. He married Earl Godwin's elder daughter Edith who, after his death, had a Life written about him. Her motives were complex: this was, after all, just at the time when William the Conqueror overthrew the country's Anglo-Saxon heritage, which she clearly wished to honour through her husband's memory. It naturally puts Edward in a good light but it does not have the full-blown characteristics of a saint's life. To become that, and so be capable of supporting a campaign for him to be recognised as a saint, it was rewritten in the early 1100s. The man who did this, Osbert of Clare, was Prior of Westminster Abbey, which Edward had lavishly rebuilt and where he was buried. Of course, the monks of Westminster had every incentive to promote Edward's cult, and Osbert approached his task in the full knowledge of how he needed to modify the narrative and its interpretation. In particular, he seized upon the fact that Edward and Edith had not had any children and turned this into an argument that the king had been a saintly celibate even within marriage. Even so, when Osbert put the case to Pope Innocent II in 1139, the Pope postponed a decision, saying that there was not enough evidence. Another factor might well have been that the Pope and King Stephen of England had quarrelled. Twenty years later, however, the political situation changed. There was a dispute over the papal succession in 1159, and Alexander III became Pope with the strong support of Stephen's successor, Henry II. Henry, at this remove from the brutality of the Norman Conquest, conducted something of a campaign throughout his reign to rehabilitate the country's Anglo-Saxon past, and this sat well with the continuing desire of the Westminster monks to promote Edward's cult. So a fresh approach was made to the papacy, with Alexander's agreement in 1161 being seen as a political reward for Henry's support in his election. Edward's cult was further promoted by Henry III who, in 1269, on 13 October - now Edward's feast-day - moved (translated) the body to a new shrine, where it remains today.

Edward, succeeded by his brother-in-law Harold, became one of the national saints of England. But in 1351, following Edward II's establishment of the Order of the Garter, George of Lydda was proclaimed the country's patron saint.

BROOD IN THE BELFRY

Ascending the two sets of ladders that give access to the belfry at St Catherine's Church, Crook is not for the faint hearted, and the rather feeble light filtering through the louvres in the belfry makes the room somewhat eerie. I ventured up there after having tolled the bell for about five minutes at midday on Saturday to mark the death of our amazing sovereign Queen Elizabeth, and I was amply rewarded. At first I thought it was a bat silently circling above my head, but as my eyes became accustomed to the poor light I realised that it was a swallow. It was obviously a little alarmed at my appearance in its safe home, and after a couple of circuits it silently and deftly disappeared out one of the narrow slits in the northern louvre where the protective grill was missing, only to return again a few minutes later with provender for a row of little beaky heads protruding from a cup-shaped mud nest clamped to the side of one of the beams. What a magic moment and well worth the climb! I retreated and left the dutiful parent to its duties.

I was rather concerned at this bird's continued presence this late in summer but apparently swallows can produce up to three broods in a year, and as long as they are away on their journey to their winter habitat by October they should be ok.

The swallow is distinguished from other similar birds (e.g. Swifts and House Martins) by its whitish under-parts, its chestnut throat and its forked tail with long streamers. Long ago it was thought that when swallows disappeared in winter they hid at the bottom of lakes or flew to the moon. We now know that most of them fly to South Africa in search of food.

It is amazing to think that swallows will, each year, fly some sixteen thousand miles to and from Africa, over the Sahara Desert and across the Mediterranean Sea, feeding and presumably sleeping on the wing. They arrive here in spring with pin-point accuracy, back at the place where they were fledged – no maps; no sat-nav! Their stamina and their navigation surely put us in awe of God's creation.

Swallows generally need the insides of buildings for their nesting places. Barns, porches, out-buildings and belfries are the most chosen sites - sites which are becoming scarce in this modern age, thus accounting in part to the declining numbers of these delightful spring visitors. Swallows rarely nest under open eaves – such nests are the nesting sites of house-martins. Personally I think it is sad when the quinquennial surveys that are obligatory for churches instruct us to put up grills to prevent these birds nesting in the belfry. As far as I am aware they do no harm nesting in this most ideal of places, and in view of the effort that they have made to reach this place, they deserve something of a welcome, especially as we are now encouraged to make our churches eco-friendly. My oldest child has started school and, with uniforms and PE kits, the costs are mounting. The school we got into isn't within walking distance so I now need to budget for bus money five days a week too. We're already pretty stretched - is there any extra help I can get?

On the Citizens Advice website, we have lots of information on the support you might be entitled to for school-related costs. If you're claiming benefits it's worth checking if you can get extra help for things like school lunches, transport and uniforms.

Children in Reception, Year I and Year 2 automatically get free school meals. For older children, you can apply for free school meals if you claim certain types of benefits. The full list is available on the Citizens Advice website, and includes Universal Credit, Child Tax Credit and Income Support.

For transport costs, your local education authority might be able to offer free or discounted transport if you're not able to walk to the school. Contact them directly to find out how they can support you.

Your local education authority might also help you with activity and school uniform costs, if you're on a low income. You're probably considered to be on a low income if you get means-tested benefits like Universal Credit or Housing Benefit. There are also some local charitable schemes that can help - check with your school, as they will usually know what is available in your area. Schools can sometimes also advise on finding cheap or free second-hand uniforms.

If your child is disabled or has a health condition, you can also claim Disability Living Allowance (this isn't means-tested).


