A LETTER FROM NICK GRAY

What do you think?

Do we live "on the earth", or "in the world"? Are we enmeshed as part of creation all around us, or do we, as select beings, exist to manage and take of the earth's provision?

Is the rest of the world a "backdrop" to our existence, or are we an integral part of the "scenery"? Genesis 2 suggests the first of humankind Adam was *from* the earth - the Hebrew *adama*.

Since our enforced isolations during the height of the Covid pandemic we have all been much more aware of our reliance on those millions of others around us providing "essential services". In health and welfare and public utilities: all those providing the



food we eat as the supermarket shelves became depleted; from our farmers, right down to all levels of food processing and production. We are maybe less aware of those doing the "dirty" work of guarding prisons, abattoir work, military drone operators and mineral miners (of all ages). But to varying degrees we rely on their daily work for our daily existence.

Whether we crave social interaction, or are quite happy with our own company, none of us live in isolation. Church is a *community* of faith, however often we might engage. Our creeds and beliefs were shaped by the considered inspiration of previous generations of believers. Our liturgical prayers are spoken and shared daily across a worldwide communion of believers.

Our life is not just about "God and me", or even "God and us" but about "God and Creation" - of which we are all a connected part. All loved by God, as he loves Creation, and all part of that love that brings Creation into being. As Psalms 148 and 150 encourage: "Let everything that has breath praise the Lord" – as well as sun, moon, mountains, trees and shining stars.

In my own sphere of particular musical interest, that of folk, roots and acoustic music, I'm presently enjoying songs from a new album from Grace Petrie called "Connectivity". I'm just finishing a small book by the performance poet Kae Tempest entitled "On Connection", and I love singing a song by one of my favourite guitarists the gospel blues singer Eric Bibb called "Connected". So I'm obviously not the only one to be thinking along these lines! Here are some lines from the chorus of that song:

"I've got my own way of talking, my own way to smile, I've got my own way of walking, my own look and style, I've got my own way of praying, my own way to sing, But I'm connected to you, everyone and everything"..."

Wishing you much joy in your engagement with this world around us.



Curlew Recovery South Lakes: 4 Chicks fledged from our valleys.

18 Pairs

Four curlew chicks are now confirmed to have fledged from our valleys. Many congratulations, and our thanks, to all the farmers and volunteers who supported the work.

54 eggs

Many lowland curlew populations fail to breed successfully, so although 4 chicks may seem relatively few, it is still a huge achievement. We think that only one chick fledged in each of the previous two years. We believe there are 18 curlew pairs breeding in the Lyth Valley in 2023 and a few more in the surrounding parishes. We found all but two of the Lyth Valley nests. Some were predated before we could protect them.

26 chicks hatched from 13 nests

4 chicks fledged

We hope that everything we have learned will help us improve in future. We have support from Durham, Lancaster, Sheffield and Dublin Universities linking our work with eggshell, feather, and remote audio monitoring data to improve our conservation activities.

CROSTHWAITE AND LYTH

Crosthwaite and Lyth W.I. gathered in force to listen to their old friend Archie Workman tell them many fascinating facts about Lewis and Harris in the Outer Hebrides, especially about the Stones of Callanish, a stone circle, perhaps one of over 900 in the British Isles, which is older than Stonehenge and equally as impressive with much freer access. He moved on to the amazing beaches in the area which not only rival the Caribbean, but were used by some Caribbean Islands in their publicity until they were caught out!

Plans were laid for the annual Summer outing, theatre trips and afternoon excursions, and Madam President thanked the members for all their help and support for the Strawberry Tea and the Village Show.

Hildegard of Bingen September 2023

I imagine that most people will not know who Hildegard of Bingen was, or why her name is alongside the date of 17 September in the Common Worship Calendar. Yet this German Benedictine nun, born c1098, is important enough to be honoured not simply with a Commemoration, but with a Lesser Festival, on a par, for example, with Gregory the Great on 3 September, or the Birth of the Virgin Mary on 8 September.

In brief, she was an extraordinary polymath – unusual for a woman at this date - and also a significant spiritual visionary. Pope Eugenius, at the Synod of Trier in the late 1140s, approved her visions as being from the Holy Spirit and gave her permission to document them.

Her visionary theology (for her visions were theologically rooted) was compiled in three great volumes. But, as if that was not enough, she also produced a considerable body of musical works for use in the liturgy, a musical morality play, two volumes on natural medicine and cures, a gospel commentary and two works on saints' lives. In addition, nearly four hundred of her letters survive, addressed to popes and emperors, abbots and abbesses. This correspondence, which includes many of the sermons she preached in the 1160s and 1170s, is one of the largest letter collections to survive from the Middle Ages. More surprisingly, perhaps, she also invented an alternative alphabet and an 'unknown language', a kind of secret code or intellectual brain-teaser.

So who was this remarkable woman? Her parents were minor nobility and she seems to have been the youngest of a large family. From her earliest years she had visions, and perhaps because of this her parents gave her as an oblate (someone not yet subject to monastic vows – in her case because she was too young) to the then newly formed Benedictine enclosed monastery at Disibodenberg where, probably around the age of 14, she was professed.

At the time of her entry into the community, she was under the guidance of Jutta, the daughter of the local Count, who subsequently became the Mistress of this growing community of women, which was at that time attached to a monastery of monks. When Jutta died in 1136, the nuns unanimously elected Hildegard as Mistress. The Abbot of the monastery wanted the female community to remain under his jurisdiction, but Hidegard was having none of this. She wanted, rather, to move the women's community to a new site so that they could become independent. When the Abbot refused, Hidegard appealed directly to the Archbishop of Mainz, who gave his approval. The Abbot still would not give way, but Hildegard eventually won through and the move was made in 1150. She founded a second monastery for her nuns in 1165. She died in 1179 at the age of 81, a truly venerable age for those times.

Hildegard was one of the first people to whom the formal process of papal canonization was applied - a practice that began in the twelfth century. But despite four attempts to complete the process, she did not graduate through all the stages, and remained at the level of beatification. Nonetheless, she was widely venerated as a saint, with her feast day being 17 September, the date of her death. Pope Benedict formalised her saintly status in 2012, thus paving the way for her to be named, later that year, as a Doctor of the Church. It is a rare title, honouring a remarkable woman.

A good place to start is the Citizens Advice website where you'll find lots of information on the support you might be entitled to for school-related costs.

The help you can get to cover school lunches will vary depending on how old your children are and if you claim benefits. Children in Reception, Years I and 2 automatically get free school meals. You can apply for free school meals for older children if you claim certain types of benefits, including Universal Credit, Child Tax Credit and Income Support.

If your child can't walk to school because of special educational needs or disabilities they should get free school transport. You may be able to get help with transport costs from your Local Education Authority (Westmorland & Furness Council) if your children can't walk because it's dangerous or too far, or if you are on a low income. They may also be able to help you with activity and school uniform costs. You're likely to be considered to be on a low income if you get means-tested benefits like Universal Credit or Housing Benefit. Check the Westmorland & Furness website for more information and to apply.

In some places there are also local charitable schemes that can help. A good place to find out about these is the school itself or Parent Teacher Association (PTA), which will usually know if these kinds of schemes exist. A lot of people are feeling the squeeze at the moment, but it's important to remember that help is available with school costs and you're not alone. For more information visit the Citizens Advice website.


