A LETTER FROM BRIAN LOCK

'A very Happy New Year to you all'.

Well that is the customary greeting for this time of year. What sort of a 'New Year' person are you? Maybe you are a positive Lord Alfred Tennyson type, keen to 'Ring out the old, ring in the new' envisaging opportunities, some known, others opportunistic and all to be embraced enthusiastically. Or are you uncertain about what disquiet and apprehension the 'new' may bring?

Similarly, there will be a range of reactions to the passing of the old year. The time since the last 'new year'. It may have been one to savour, to remember with fondness, even pride, significant family events enjoyed, or challenging long projects brought to a satisfactory conclusion. Some may be wishing they could rub out, obliterate any lingering memories of events in the past 365 days.

Time is a continuum the German writer Thomas Mann tells us in 'The Magic Mountain' (1924), which is technically correct. The clock keeps ticking, and only in a forward direction. This can feel relentless, potentially stressful, and out of our control. Fortunately, Mann goes on to write that it is '... only we mortals who ring the bells and fire off the pistols,' to announce a significant division, like a 'New Year's day'. We have a choice to insert time for reflection, we cannot stop time, but can devote a portion of it to reflect forwards and backwards about those things which we may want to pursue, or things that we wish we could have done differently.

I expect that many of you will press the 'reflect' button on New Year's Eve. Possibly just quietly by yourself, or with gathered family members and friends. I would suggest that reflection is a good habit to acquire beyond 'Old Years night' as it then enables us to plot an alternative course ahead.

For Christians these times of reflection are important. In every church service, usually near the start, there is a time to reflect on times when we have let God down. Followed by a reminder of God's forgiveness from mistakes made so that they can be left behind and forward movement restarted. The service ends with a commission to go out from the church building to live actively in the communities that we are a part of, strengthened by the prayers , teaching and fellowship of the service.

In our wider community, not least because 2024 is an election year, we need to find ways to reflect and methods to move forward. To build on existing strengths and devise ways to overcome the weaknesses and failings in 'the system' to a betterment of the common good.

I have no easy solutions to offer, but as a Christian approaching 2024 I will be noting the advice given by King George VI in his Christmas address of 1939 when

he quoted part of a poem by Minnie Louise Haskins called 'God Knows'.

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year:

"Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown".

And he replied:

"Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God.

That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way".

And I look forward to sharing the journey through 2024 with all in the Two Valleys Community.

The Baptism of Christ: An Epiphany Narrative January 2024

The season of Epiphany begins on 6 January. On this day we commemorate the visitation of the Three Wise Men to the Christ-child. The visit of the Magi is a 'manifestation': it is the first instance of how God is made known to and is recognised by those of a different race from the humble Jewish shepherds, whose 'manifestation' we commemorate on Christmas Day itself. Epiphany, which comes from a Greek word, means 'manifestation'. The marking of the beginning of Epiphany by such a radical story as that of the Magi – different race, different religion, different level of learning and social status from Mary, Joseph and the shepherds – foreshadows the universal spread of Christianity. How this began to happen in practice is told in the Acts of the Apostles, the book that follows the gospels in our bibles.

Epiphany continues for several weeks, right up to the beginning of Lent, which itself starts six weeks before Easter. During that time, readings traditionally focus on other 'manifestations' which reveal the special nature of Jesus. A couple of years ago I wrote about one of these: the episode where Jesus, at the age of twelve, went up to Jerusalem with his parents and amazed the leaders of the Temple by debating with them about the teachings of Jewish Scripture (our Old Testament) with a wisdom way beyond his years. Another is the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the river Jordan.

Jesus' baptism is told in a very similar way in Matthew chapter 3, Mark chapter I and Luke chapter 3. These three gospels, which are interrelated, are commonly referred to as the synoptic gospels because they present a similar summary of Jesus' life and teaching. The fourth gospel, written quite a bit later, in other circumstances and with different purpose, also presents Jesus' baptism, in John I vv. 29-34, but not in quite the same way. Even so, common to them all is the description of the Holy Spirit descending upon Jesus in the form of a dove, and a clear assertion that this person, in one sense a man like all others, is also the Son of God. In John's gospel this is confidently asserted by John the Baptist, but in the synoptic accounts the narrative gives us God's own words:' This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased'. These familiar words are from Matthew. There is very slight variation in Mark and Luke, but no difference at all in what is being asserted.

In its own terms, as an incident in Jesus' life, this is an account of a public 'manifestation', an epiphany narrative. But, taking a longer view, the baptism was also seen as an early 'manifestation' of the doctrine of the Trinity. This complex theology of the unified identity of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, took some centuries to work out. But the baptism narrative was a constant reference point and, in Christian art, was a scene that could allude to this quite difficult and abstract idea in graphic form since the Father, whose vocal presence is recorded in the gospels, was represented by a hand showing beneath the cloud; the Son (Jesus) is of course central to the image; and Holy Spirit is present in the form of the dove.

- Keep the heat in: Check your home for any gaps in the doors, windows and floors. Blocking any holes could save you around £30 a year. It is important to allow for some ventilation as without it mould and damp can form.
- Turn off anything you're not using: Turning your appliances, like TVs and washing machines, off instead of leaving them on standby could save around £60 a year. Turning off lights— even if it's just for a few seconds could save around £25 a year.
- Use LED lightbulbs, which cost less to run.
- Watch your water usage: Cutting your shower time by just one minute can make a difference. If everyone in a four-person household with a water meter did this, they could save around £75 a year.

If you're struggling to afford your energy bills, you might be able to get support from the government or your energy supplier. The first step is to contact your supplier to find out what they can offer. You may be eligible for benefits including the Warm Home Discount, Cold Weather Payments or the Household Support Fund. 
