



A LETTER FROM GEORGE BRIGGS

What's happening in the garden?

Things have been appearing: first came the snowdrops (a little later than last year), followed by more colours gradually coming through and carpeting the ground – and the daffodils coming up to bring some gold! I love the signs that spring is here – and everything that it promises. Perhaps I wouldn't say that lightly if I had to see in the new lambs and calves!



What's happening in the garden?

This is a pretty revealing question as we approach the celebration of Easter this month – there are two very significant scenes that take place in a garden. In the first, Jesus is found praying, desperate about what he is going to do, left to wrestle alone whilst his friends sleep nearby. Jesus cries out, asking if there is another way to draw the world back to God the Father, another way to secure our freedom and the healing of hearts and lives and nations. But as he expresses his anguish he also expresses his resolve to finish what he came to do. "Not my will, but yours..." he says, not in submission to the cruel whim of an angry God, but in agreement with the one so filled with love that he would give everything to make us his own... In the garden, he chose us. So Jesus' betrayal and arrest led him from the garden to his trial and his death.

What's happening in the garden?


Some of Jesus' followers take his body and lay it in a new tomb, in a garden near to the place he was crucified. They leave it there whilst they observe the custom of the Sabbath, and early on Sunday morning, while it was still dark, we read in John's Gospel that Mary Magdalene came and found the stone had been rolled away from the tomb entrance. She runs to find Peter and John, distraught that the body has gone. The two men return with her. They hadn't realised that Jesus would rise from the dead, and leave in wonder. But Mary stays, weeping, inconsolable. The excitement of Peter and John, and even the appearance of angels in the empty tomb are no comfort – it is Jesus that she wants. She wants to see him again. A figure behind her she assumes to be a gardener asks her what the matter is, and she explains her desperation – just tell me where to find him... Then Jesus says her name, "Mary!", and at once she knows who it is and throws her arms around him. No amount of evidence and other people's wonder would satisfy her – only meeting Jesus for herself in the garden.

Mary takes us to the heart of Easter, in that garden – it is her encounter with the risen Jesus that shows us what Easter is about – that we meet him ourselves. When she left that garden, she would never be the same again!

Two gardens – he chose us in the first, meets us in the second – have a joyful and life-giving Easter!

CALLING ALL PARISHES

VICAR VACANCY UPDATE

We had two applicants for the post of Vicar here, and the shortlisting group met on Friday 28th February to discuss the applications. This group comprises two PCC representatives from each of the five parishes, a representative from each of two Patrons, Rural Dean Rev. Anne Pettifor and Ven. Vernon Ross, Archdeacon (Chair). Following discussion, and advice from Bishop Rob and Vernon, it was agreed that neither applicant would be called for interview.

Although this is disappointing, it was a brave decision. We want the right person, God's choice, to be our new Vicar, and neither candidate fitted that bill. Perhaps we thought it would be straightforward, and we would have a successful candidate first time, but it's not worked out like that. So, we need to be praying even more about the recruitment process, for the God's person to apply. It is a wonderful place to live and work, and Vernon described our Parish Profile as 'outstanding', so we have done our best to attract someone.

The non-appointment may not greatly affect the timescale of finding a new Vicar for us. We will advertise again after Easter, by which time those Curates across the country who are completing their training in May should be in a position to be looking and applying for their first incumbency. They won't have a notice period to serve, and so would be available more quickly than someone already in a parish.

Please keep praying that God would bring the right person to us at the right time. God, the giver of life,

whose Holy Spirit wells up within your Church:

hear our prayer for all your faithful people in the Two Valleys,

that by the Spirit's gifts we may each be equipped to be an instrument of your love.

Grant wisdom and discernment

to all those involved in the process of appointing a new incumbent,

and draw amongst us one who will lead us and guide us in the victory of your love,

through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord.

REPORTS & NEWS

BRIGSTEER WI

Brigsteer hosted the Lyth Valley Group Meeting recently, when our speaker was David Moreland, head of butchery at Westmorland Farm Shops. We heard a very interesting (and amusing) talk about his long and varied career in the meat trade, through difficult times like the BSE outbreak, and Foot and Mouth disease which was so devastating for Cumbria. David was asked to set up the butchery department at Tebay Services. He sources meat locally and uses all the different cuts of the animals for sale in his shops and cafes. He brought along some gorgeous sheepskins and wool products which we could purchase. Next month we will have an interactive talk led by Philip Burley on the history of puzzles.

CARTMEL FELL WI

18 members enjoyed a very informative talk by Angela White, "Building Better Bones" Osteoporosis, the silent disease. Her whole working life has had connections with health care, latterly specialising in orthopaedic trauma, hip fractures and osteoporosis. She is a trustee of Age UK and at 53 started running, leading to running from John O'Groats to Lands End. Angela appreciated running was not for everyone but keeping active and supple was most important. Explaining the changes in bones at different ages and helpful dietary suggestions made for a most useful presentation. The raffle winner was Margaret and the winners of an entry of 13 in the competition for a wooden object were Sheila, Marion and Florence. Molly reported on the meeting in Windermere 'Inspiring Women' she had attended with Anne. Though interesting and a good tea, the turnout had been poor. 7 members were hoping to go to the Group meeting at Brigsteer. Our next meeting is on 9th April when Rob David will give a talk Muncaster Castles' Wartime Secret: Protecting the Tate Gallery. This will be an open meeting with refreshments and a good raffle, the proceeds of which will go to charity. The competition will be for a small artwork. As always, everyone will be made most welcome.

CROOK WI

For the February meeting the speaker was Mr John Bolwell who told us about how he had travelled widely, especially in the east, and became interested in different forms of Tai Chi, Taiko drumming, martial arts and various interesting movements and exercises including juggling

The speaker at the March meeting was Captain Colin Thomson who gave a very interesting talk entitled "Titanic". He had lots of graphics, statistics and photographs explaining how the "unthinkable" happened with the sinking of the Titanic on its maiden voyage in 1912. It is amazing how much interest there still is after all these years.

It was a privilege to listen to a young man who knew his subject inside out and so obviously enjoyed it.

18 members gathered in the Punchbowl Inn in Crosthwaite for our annual Spring Lunch. The food was delicious and enjoyed by all the participants, many of whom appreciated not having to travel too far.
